VT Proficiency-Based Learning Seminar

Three-Year Plan Protocol

Purpose:

- To develop a shared understanding of the major pieces of efforts in shifting to a proficiency-based system
- To begin to develop a three-year plan for implementation.¹
- To identify more immediate professional learning needs.

Process:

- 1. Review sample three-year plan. (10 min)
- 2. What have you already done? Mark "complete." (15 min)
- 3. What additional steps do you think might be necessary in your local context? (30 min)
- 4. How would you adjust timelines to reflect your local context? (30 min)

Short-Term Professional Learning Process

This process is arranged as a discussion, following a series of prompts. It is often helpful if one person offers to take notes on a shared document or scribe comments on chart paper.

- 1. What time do we have for professional learning? How effectively is it used? What time could be utilized for professional learning and/or how might be use our time most effectively? (10 min)
- 2. What is already on the plate for professional learning this year? To what extent is it connected to proficiency-based learning? How might we connect what we have been doing in our work to proficiency-based learning? (20 min)
- 3. What topics or skills might our district need to invest in for professional learning to make an effective transition to proficiency-based learning? (10 min) This step can be a brainstorm, scribing ideas on chart paper.
- 4. Narrow down topics/skill list to 3-4 that are most attainable before the 2015 school year. Team members can use dots to vote. (5 min)
- 5. What steps can we take to help focus our professional learning time on these topics and skills? (20 min)

¹ Note: we will be revisiting your district's three-year plan throughout the seminar series. While you should expect to have a completed three-year plan by the end of the series, you should not expect to have a complete plan in December.
